

What can the Hornet Health Center do for my child?

The School-Based Health Center (SBHC) is available at Bryant Elementary School. The SBHC is staffed with pediatricians from Arkansas Pediatric Clinic: Dr. Anton Duke and Dr. Kristi Hawkins.

Mental health professionals help with therapy, intervention, support, education and case management.

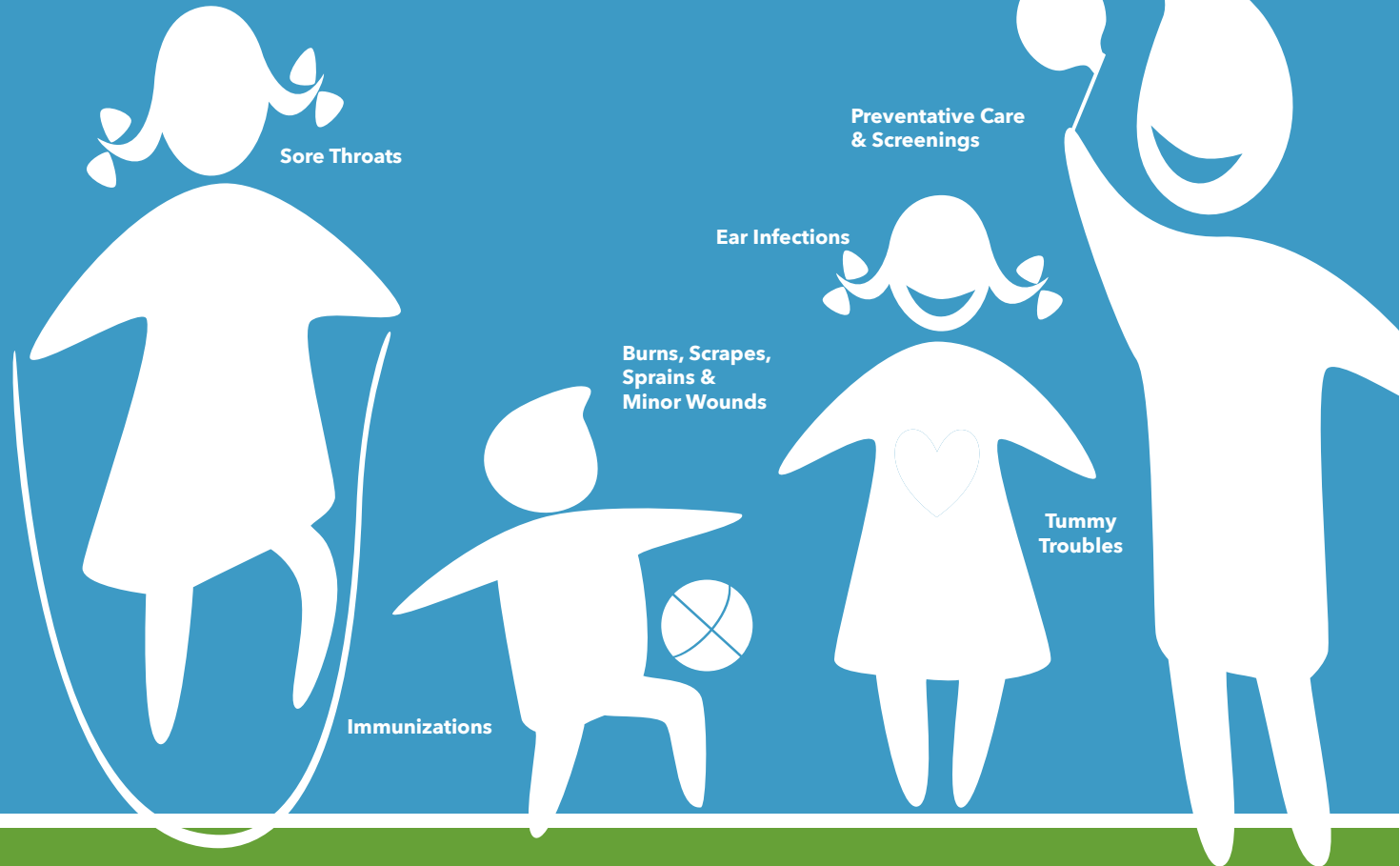
Who can use the Hornet Health Center?

The SBHC is able to provide health services to Bryant Elementary students, as well as other children in the Bryant School District.

What are my payment options when using the health center?

The SBHC accepts Medicaid and private health insurance. If your child(ren) does not currently have health insurance coverage, the SBHC staff will work with you to help enroll your child(ren) in Medicaid if applicable.

How do I get my child enrolled in the health center?

Simply complete the parent consent and child health history forms and return to the SBHC. Forms are available through your child's school, school nurse, or download at bryantschools.org/school-based-health-center.

Once forms are completed and signed, return to school or bring to scheduled appointment.

How do I make an appointment for my child?

If you wish to use the SBHC please contact the Hornet Health Center at 501-653-5040 or call Arkansas Pediatric Clinic at 501-664-4117 and ask to be seen at the Bryant SBHC (Hornet Health Center) location.

Can my child still visit the school nurse?

The SBHC provides services beyond what a school nurse can provide but does not replace the school nurse.

If your child gets ill during the school day, your school nurse will contact you and coordinate care with the SBHC staff.
